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TravelWise Week 2023



TravelWise Week is a world-wide, week-long Travel Challenge where Modeshift asks you and your organisation to Travel Wisely!

The week promotes active travel, public transport, and other cleaner and healthier transport choices, and culminates in World Car Free Day

TravelWise Week provides the perfect opportunity to present realistic travel alternatives to employees, students, and the wider public, whilst raising awareness around the impacts of travel choices on an individual's health and wellbeing, and on the environment

TravelWise Week 2023



During TravelWise Week, schools, workplaces, and other organisations are encouraged to hold a 5-day Travel Challenge by delivering a series of active and sustainable travel activities from Monday to Friday.

Local authorities are encouraged to organise and deliver activities across the full 7-days of TravelWise Week that celebrate active and sustainable travel, ending the week on a high by running events on World Car Free Day.

All organisations taking part have the opportunity to be recognised through Modeshift's **TravelWise Week Awards!**

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TravelWise Week – Schools and Modeshift STARS



Local Authorities – encourage all schools to get engage by promoting TravelWise week and by sharing the online resources.

Schools – read through the resources and select activities to raise awareness with pupils, parents/carers and staff and plan and deliver a range of initiatives that fit with your school's needs.

What can you do? Example timetable



- **Mon 18**th **Sept** Make your Travelwise Week Promise talk about what Travelwise Week means to your school (R9) and make a promise to go 'car free' on Friday. (CU4)
- **Tues 19**th **Sept** Design your own STARS Town (R19). Pupils design their own town thinking about where people might want to go and how they will get their actively and sustainably (PR8).
- **Wed 20**th **Sept** Travelwise Week Scavenger Hunt how many things can pupils spot on their journey to school? (W9)
- Thu 21st Sept Street Name Search How may street names do you pass on the way to school?
 Write a story using the names. (CU2 & CU10)
- Fri 22nd Sept Car Free Day be part of a worldwide event where we go car free (AQ2 &AQ3) for the day. You could set up walking trains (W10), active travel breakfasts (W14) or bling your wheels day (C15).

TravelWise Week and STARS accreditation



How does TravelWise Week fit in with STARS accreditation?

All TravelWise Week activities and initiatives that you deliver during the week can be logged on the STARS system and count towards accreditation

All you need to do is remember to take a note of what each initiative involves and record evidence which can be added to the system in the usual way

Adding TravelWise Week initiatives to your STARS Travel Plan

If you are already engaged in STARS and have had some ideas for delivering initiatives, you might want to use TravelWise Week as an opportunity to launch them.

Starting your STARS Travel Plan

If you haven't started your STARS Travel Plan you can use TravelWise Week to really get it underway

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Example Workplace Programme 2023



Monday 18th September - Make your
TravelWise Week promises. Use day one to raise
awareness of TravelWise Week and encourage
as many colleagues as possible to complete
TravelWise Week promises committing to go 'car
free' on Friday.

Tuesday 19th September - Plan your journeys
Hold a journey planning and active travel
workshop to help individuals to fully understand
the local cycling and walking infrastructure.

Wednesday 20th September - Dr Bike
Ensure that those looking to cycle to site have
a bike they are safe and confident to do so.

Thursday 21st September - Promote public transport options Hold a workplace information event or where possible invite transport providers in to hold their own promotion events.

Friday 22nd September Car Free Friday!

Join organisations around the world by taking part in Car Free Day. Encourage colleagues, customers and visitors to find an alternative mode of travel for one day.

Remember you can commit to as many initiatives throughout the week as you feel is practical, however we encourage those looking to chose on specific day to look to "World Car Free Friday"



Further Initiatives...



Personalised Journey Planning / active travel maps.

By holding a personalised journey planning and active travel route workshop you can help individuals to fully understand the local cycling and walking infrastructure.

Cycle to Work Day,

Consider appointing a cycling "champion" to help lead a 'Cycle to Work' day by sharing his regular commute and helping others to undertake a pre or post cycle ride in the surrounding area.

Carshare "Meet & Greet" morning.

A simple and effective tip to bring those looking to carshare together in order for them to identify shared routes, travel times and challenges. Carsharing can have a dramatic effect upon an organisations overall carbon footprint and help you to manage carpark demand.

Promote public transport ticketing discounts and incentives.

Showcase these benefits at a workplace information event or where possible invite transport providers in to hold their own promotion events.

Walk to win!

Do you have multiple sites within a short distance of one another or perhaps have staff regularly travelling between different campus or service locations. Encourage these journeys to be undertaken by foot through a targeted campaign.

Track and share your organisations carbon footprint during TravelWise week.

Create a comparison by looking at the travel behaviour undertaken by employees within TravelWise week, and the typical mode taken prior to the campaign.



Travel 2 Next - Example





NEXT PLC sought to repurpose an area of their carpark at their head office in Leicester. Although this was done on a temporary basis initially as part of a campaign to influence staff wellbeing this has now become a permeant fixture outside of the main entrance, an area visible to both staff and visitors.

The area has picnic benches, table tennis and regularly invites external vendors in to create a space for events, collaborative working and promotion of schemes such as travel2next.

This is a great example of how an initiative developed within a specific campaign period can have a longer lasting effect upon the workforce and reclaim areas of a site which have traditionally been handed over to carparking.

Car Free Day Tips



- **Information** provide clear information to everyone at your school about the aims and expectations of your Car Free Day. You might want to let your neighbours know as well. Clear communication will ensure that your school community and neighbours are not taken by surprise.
- **Involve Partners** the more the merrier. The local authority, politicians, local businesses, the Police. The more people you involve, the more successful your event is likely to be
- Share alternatives if you are closing any part of your site, or surrounding roads to cars, ensure that people are aware of their travel options. Could they walk instead or use public transport, perhaps park further away for the day and walk the rest of the way.
- Show impact collect figures on how many people take part in your event to show the positive benefits of your Car Free Day
- Celebrate success make sure people know how successful your event was, and share your results with Modeshift to be in with a chance of winning a National TravelWise Week Award


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A future shaped by (and for) cars

- tearing down public transport infrastructure (mainly tramways) and monumental buildings



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
How many liters of oil?

BURN, BABY, BURN!

- During its life time, an average car burns close to 17.000 liters of petrol or around 13.500 liters of diesel. Stack these barrels on top of each other, and they reach up to 90m in the air.
- Transport is responsible for 2/3 of total EU oil demand.
- The EU transportation system burns 82 billion litres of gasoline each year (excluding airplane fuels)!







How much can we save?

IMMEDIATE EFFECT

- End fuel duty tax cuts that prop up demand and mostly benefit the rich -> **94 mln** barrels saved.
- Combine homeworking, car-free days, speed limits and a shift to public transport and cycling ->100 mln barrels saved.
- Reduce corporate flying -> 43 mln barrels saved.
- Introduce efficiency measures for trucks such as lower speed limits, aerodynamic devices and more efficient tyres -> 36 mln barrels saved.

In total 273 mln barrels saved with quick wins.

We can't take away everyone's car overnight, but we can **stop making traveling by car easier** and easier.

Marchetti's constant says that people's travel time will always remain one hour, regardless of what forms of transportation we have.

Travel time savings don't actually exist.
